A conversation on "The Child and the Working Mother" will be held at the Center for Continuing Education of Women, 330 Thompson, Ann Arbor, on Thursday, Feb. 24, from 1 to 3 p.m.

Of the 30 million U.S. women in the labor force, some 28 percent have children under 18. Working mothers and those who choose not to work are seeking ways to combine job and family and provide adequate care and development for children.

The center conversation will discuss informally some of the questions, asked and reached by professionally employed women as well as those not now in the market-place.

Now Is A Good Time To Fill Cookie Jars

You may very well have Girl Scout cookies coming at you from all sides during the next month.

Girl Scouts in the Huron Valley Council, which includes Plymouth and Westland, will begin their annual cookie sale by taking orders on Friday, Feb. 18.

Those in the Metropolitan Detroit Council will have to wait until March 3 to begin selling cookies but will have on-the-spot deliveries. This council includes Livonia, Redford Township and Westland.

Girl Scouts in southern Oakland County, which includes Farmington and Southfield, have already taken orders for cookies, but Senior Girl Scouts in Farmington will have an open sale day (in stores and shopping centers) on Saturday, March 11.

The Huron Valley Scouts will see prospective customers until March 6 and will deliver cookies between April 14 and 26.

THE DETROIT COUNCIL will sell cookies through March 12 in more than 600 stores, banks and neighborhood shops. Girl Scouts of the Metropolitan Detroit Council are not permitted to

go door-to-door for funds and must cookie booths make it convenient for them and for shoppers.

Mrs. Jack Hagopian of Plymouth is Huron Valley cookie sale chairman and area chairmen include Mrs. James Rorabacher of Plymouth and Mrs. Ursula Lang and Mrs. Calvin Morrison of Plymouth.

Scouts in the council, which includes western Wayne, Washtenaw and Livingston Counties, are aiming to sell 355,000 boxes this year. Boxes are 50 cents each. Eighteen and a half cents of that represents profit for the council and five cents is profit for the troop.

Mrs. Hagopian said that by popular demand the council is returning this year to the Burry Brand of cookies sold in years before 1971.

The Detroit Council will have a new chocolate chip Girl Scout cookie this year, along with its five old favorites. Containing almost double the amount of cookies, the larger boxes feature colorful photographs of 11 different wild flowers.

"The term 'cookie sale' is somewhat misleading," according to Mrs. Richard E. Cross, council president.

In the past, contributors received a small box for each 50-cent donation. This year, we thank them with an almost-double size box of cookies for each dollar donated.
