Bids shall be addressed to the Board of Education, and will be received by the Board of Education, c/o Director of Buildings and Grounds, 35000 Shawansee, Farmington, Michigan 48024, until 4 p.m., Wednesday, March 22, 1972, at which time and place bids will be opened and publicly read aloud.

The work consists of the removal of existing material and reconstruction of a new built-up roof on a new light weight aggregate concrete pitched surface.

The Owner will require the successful bidder to provide a Performance Bond in the amount of 100% of the contract inclusive all labor and material.

re-enact the franchise agreement made with Detroit Edison providing for unidirectional signing in addition to the basic contract function of providing electrical service to township residents.

The franchise had been approved almost a year ago but never formally signed by Edison which had asked the board to re-enact the franchise. The proposal will now be placed on the May 16 primary ballot for voter approval.

Trustees adopted a resolution requesting the Oakland County Road Commission to hold hearings on paving the 500-foot strip of Drake Road between Freedom and the Farmington City limits.

The city has declared the necessity to pave Drake and would like the township portion paved at the same time. The road commission will now notify property owners along that strip of its intent to pave and, if there is

no opposition, will establish a special assessment district.

Joseph T. Brennan, township attorney, suggested the project be funneled through the county when trustees expressed a reluctance to take on the work with township matching funds.

Brennan also pointed out that half of that 500-foot strip of Drake belongs to the city so the county would be assessing only one-half of the strip.

THE BOARD denied a developer's request for public hearing on a rezoning to allow location of a recreation vehicle sales outlet on the north side of Eight Mile west of Gill Rd.

The planning commission denied the request at a preliminary meeting and trustees Monday night upheld that action by voting to deny the rezoning petition.

Charles Lowe, representing the developer, said a building 125-by-50 feet would be located on the six-acre site with a total value of \$350,000.
