STILL TIME TO PLANT YOUR GARDEN

With produce coming onto the market very slowly, it is more important than ever that everyone should raise as much of their own produce as possible.

Everyone has been delayed in planting gardens this year, but now that the break is here, planting of vegetable crops is the first order of business for the home gardener. It is possible to set out all plants and sow seeds which have been held back because of the low temperatures and heavy rains.

There are several crops which may not be planted at this time, such as peas, spinach, onions or parsnips. But there is still time to plant and harvest all other commonly grown vegetables. Get your garden in now—you'll be glad you have it.

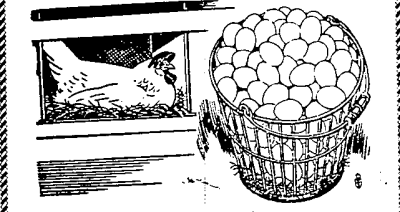

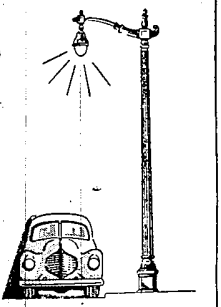
Report Broken Street Lights
