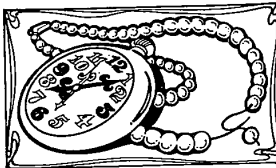

Continued from Page 1C summer cottage near Sarnia. Kathy went to Central Michigan University for two years, majoring in art. For her junior year, she went to Europe for independent study, traveling

with a friend for a while and winding up on the Doyle homestead.

"My friends figured I would want to get away after about a week there," she said. "I stayed four months and never was bored."

Her great-uncle proved fine company, she said. "He's 75 years old and he never married and had never been more than a few miles from home until I came," she added. "But he's very open - likes people and rides his bicycle all over and enjoyed talking to all my friends, including the ones with long hair."

"The reason he didn't marry was that after my grandfather left times were bad and he felt the responsibility for taking care of the farm and his two sisters, and by the time circumstances were better it was too late. But he loves people and is delighted to have us coming."

"He'll be able to give us advice - he's run the farm for years and the only problem now is the physical labor."

KATHY AND ALAN see a couple of problems that could come with the move. Although Wexford is 200 miles from the scene of religious strife in Northern Ireland, they aren't quite sure how the "mixed" marriage - Kathy is Catholic and Alan Protestant - will be accepted. Kathy said she didn't note any evidence of animosity toward Protestants but there was always awareness of differences. "It could be a problem," they agree, but figure they'll play it by ear.

"My grandfather certainly has no regrets about coming here, but he's glad that I can be happy in Ireland."
