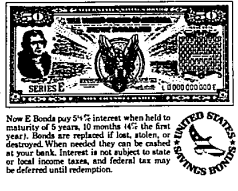

Care Of Children On Campus Is Conference Topic

Campus child care will be the topic of a day-long conference Saturday, March 11 in the University of Michigan-Dearborn's Fair Lane Center.

Representatives from 25 metropolitan area colleges and community colleges are expected to participate. The conference is co-sponsored by the University of Michigan-Dearborn Early Learning and Child Development Center and the Child Care Committee of the National Organization of Women.

The program will include a series of workshops designed to highlight the potentials, organization and problems of campus child care centers.

INTERESTED CITIZENS not affiliated with a campus child center also are invited to attend. A \$2 registration fee will be charged all participants.

Workshop topics will deal with "Organization and Ad-

ministration of Centers-First Steps," with discussion centering on location, need, eligibility, hours, staff and equipment needs.

Other workshops deal with the legal and financial aspects of child care center administration, relationships of campus centers to a university and communities, and programming.

WORKSHOP SESSIONS begin at 10 a.m., following a general orientation and registration period. A luncheon will be served at the Fair Lane Center, with each workshop repeated in the afternoon. The conference will close with a general panel discussion by students and college administrators.

Conference organizers have also arranged for limited child care services during conference sessions. Reservations for child care services and conference reservations may be made by phoning the U-M Dearborn campus.
