

U-D Testing Center Schedules Open House

A University of Detroit center set up to diagnose problems of children with learning difficulties will hold open house this week to make residents of the metropolitan area more aware of its services.

The time to visit the Children's Psychodiagnostic Center, 16158 Petoskey, Detroit, will be 4 to 7 p.m. Friday, March 10. The center is located east of Livonia and south of Florence near the U-D campus.

special needs of educationally-deprived children and work with teachers to plan educational and mental health programs for individual children.

Preventing failure and dropping out, improving emotional and mental health of children, determining causes of learning and adjustment problems, making early identification of exceptional children and recommending specialized help also are among aims of the center.

The testing program costs \$20, with adjustments available for parents unable to pay. Small fees are charged for subsequent sessions.

Parents or agencies caring children to the center are asked to provide a short statement detailing the situation and problems of the child, including pertinent background information.

They also are asked to state whether an interpretation of test results should be forwarded to such interested parties as the family physician or the child's school.

APPOINTMENTS for the service may be made by telephoning the University of Detroit center after 9:30 a.m. Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Dr. Justin Pikunas, University of Detroit professor, is director of the Children's Psychodiagnostic Center.

THE CENTER now offers complete aptitude and school achievement testing to children up to the age of 16. It also offers psychological counseling service for children tested and their parents.

Evaluation that can be offered includes intelligence testing, achievement test and diagnosis of adjustment problems.

The service also connects on learning disabilities, seeks to prevent potential personal and school problems. Identify
