**Walk Study Group Meets**

**FARMINGTON**

Appointees of the Farmington Township Board to the citizens sidewalk committee met for the first time March 4 with Supervisor Earl Teeple to organize and map out action to be taken.

Elected committee chairman was William Hatton of the Farmington Village Apartments on Nine Mile Rd. Hatton, a township Democrat and appointee of Teeple, is a past president of the Farmington Township Road and Civic Association and served on the township's road committee.

Teeple says that with the talent of the committee, it should not be necessary to meet more than a few times to accomplish the work of determining where sidewalks are needed and to establish a priority for installation of these walks.

Cooperation from the schools, police and road commission will be sought within the next few weeks to determine locations, traffic counts, pedestrian counts and other statistics needed for the decisions.

The committee is planning on meeting weekly during March to accelerate their actions.
