





## **GM Employes** Collect Awards

A total of 1,731 General Motors employes from the Livonia area were awarded 163,645 under the annual General Motors suggestion plan for 1971. Employes get paid for suggestions covering the entire spectrum of GM operations, including safety improvements, better quality, design, methods, time and material savings, and improved househeping. Since the program began in 1912, employes have received more than \$155 million for suggestions.

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Last year \$13.4 million was awarded to employes. Sixty persons received the maximum award of \$10,000, and another 1,520 employes received awards of \$1,000 or more, of which 21 emplo
