Pure Organic Compound  
Sugar is the pure organic com-  
pound produced in largest quantity  
in the United States, according to  
Chemical and Engineering News.  
Production of sugar is 22 times that  
of total production of coal in the  
United States, while 75 times more  
sugar is produced than isopropyl al-  
cohol. Other pure organic com-  
pounds produced in lesser quantities  
in the United States for use in in-  
dustry are aniline phthalic anhy-  
dride, formaldehyde, phenol, coal-  
tar dyes, and glycerol.

Egg Temperature  
Fresh-laid eggs have a tempera-  
ture of 100 to 102 degrees. Experi-  
ments have shown that fertile eggs  
will start to germinate if kept at  
temperatures of 80 to 85 degrees,  
and that food quality of eggs de-  
creases rapidly unless they are  
cooled promptly and stored at 65  
degrees or less.
