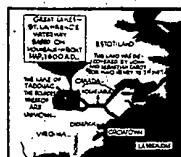


Pvt. Herbert Long

Storing Potatoes

Potatoes should be stored in a cool place as can be found—possibly in the basement where the humidity can be kept fairly high. It is desirable to cover the tubers to exclude the light and to prevent excessive movement of air. Under these conditions early potatoes can usually be kept in good condition for several weeks.

Non-Botting Fabric

A new modified cotton fabric that will not mildew nor rot, and that has withstood burial in the ground more than six months with only slight loss in strength has been developed by scientists of the U. S. department of agriculture. One important use of the treated fabric will be for manufacture of bags for packing fruits and vegetables.

Hereford Herds Increasing
There're now 18,352 breeders of Hereford cattle in the United States with a total of 774,537 animals registered. Five years ago, 13,002 breeders reported 587,078 registered Herefords in their herds. Texas leads the list with 164,361 cattle in 2,940 herds. Other states in the top 10 are Nebraska, Kansas, Oklahoma, Montana, Colorado, Missouri, Iowa, New Mexico and California.
