To the Editor:

The last of my Six Point School Building Program which I want to present here is in reference to a Citizen's Educational Advisory Committee to assist and advise the Board, the Superintendent, and the architect in planning the expansion of the school system. Such procedure is the American democratic way. It provides opportunity for community leaders to participate and be of real service in a most vital American institution, that of public education; an institution which, when properly guided, makes this nation great and strong and the moral hope of the world.

Such a committee may be appointed by the Board of Education. It should not be too large, perhaps about a dozen members in addition to the members of the Board. It should be representative of all the civic and neighborhood groups in the community.

Good public relations are not automatic. People are richly suspicious of that which is presented suddenly without adequate explanation. This is particularly true in reference to educational matters. Cooperation and participation in community affairs by community leaders is the best public relations possible. It enables people to feel that they have a definite stake in the progress of our country. It gives a definite outlet to the spirit of citizenship.

Good public relations require organized effort which such a committee could provide. They should be continuous rather than sporadic, hasty and intense. Without such organization for help in a matter and disseminating the information throughout the district any Board may find itself bewildered and without conviction as to which way to turn when faced by a problem. Such a committee would help convince people that the Board is not a closed corporation with something to hide. It would help in making accurate and deliberate studies. It would help make for sound and deliberate decisions by the Board, the Superintendent, and the architect. It would help the people themselves make sound decisions.

The committee would in no way impair the efficiency of the Board, rather it would enhance it. It would in no way dissolve the local responsibilities of the Board for the decisions required by law. It would not be a new thing in this community. Our Township consolidation was accomplished by a similar committee. We need another and more comprehensive committee now, a permanent one. **BIBLE TEACHER WILL SPEAK AT ROYAL OAK**




