more cars and personnel.

(6) Development of parks, installation of equipment, such as tennis courts, skating rinks, toboggan slides, swimming pool, tables and stoves for recreation and convenience of our City residents.

(7) New Public Library — Through the cooperation of Farmington Township and the City of Farmington, plans have been considered.

(8) New Municipal Hospital.

(9) New Municipal Jail.

(10) Installation of street curbs.

(11) New building to provide shelter for supplies, materials and equipment needed at once.

(12) New fire truck and equipment to replace present one.

(13) Installation of a water softener system.

(14) Engineering, plans and supervision are required for such improvements.

(15) Legal advice and cost of bond issues required.

These are only some of the major projects which are of immediate concern. There are many others, which will require consideration as our City grows.

The City Commission has given much thought to the importance or demands for future growth.

Good judgment and action will be required to provide our City with the developments needed and still be within our reasonable ability to pay for same and keep our credit on the same standard that it now enjoys.

**Sentry Club To Have St. Patrick's Party**


