Buddy Poppy on the President of
a White House ceremony which
will launch the annual Buddy Pop-
py Sale set for Memorial Day
week. Betty's father, Pvt. Arthur
Alvin Hall, 25, was killed in action
December 21, 1914 in Germany.
He was a member of Lansing VFV
Post 3727.

Dunlap C. Clark, president of the
American National Bank of Scia-
marco and a director of the U.S.
Chamber of Commerce has been
elected chairman of the board of
trustees, named recently by Gov-
ernor Harry F. Kelly to adminis-
ter Michigan's \$50,000,000 Veter-
ans' Trust Fund. Offices will be
set up in the Cadillac Square
Building, Detroit and the Board
will begin its task at once.

Because someone remembered
that John Emery of Grand Rapids,
Michigan's first national com-
mander of The American Legion,
once presented a plaque to the city
of Saint Die, France every one of
the 1,569 hungry, destitute, wound-
ed and needy children of that
war-ravaged town will soon re-
ceive an 11-pound measure of com-
fort and cheer from the American
Legion Auxiliary. The Auxiliary
has been assigned a group of the
1,569 youngsters, and each
child will receive one 11-pound
package of clothing and food in-
cluding powdered milk, cocoa, un-
cooked cereals, canned fruits and
vegetables and dehydrated soups
and food. These packages will be
shipped directly to the children
on or before May 1, 1946.

In many of Michigan's 475 Amer-
ican Legion posts the younger
veterans now outnumber World
War I men. The post at Newberry
for instance recently reported 262
members, including 87 "old-timers"
as against 175 World War II men.

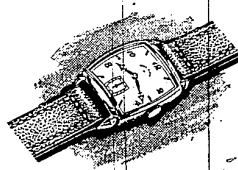

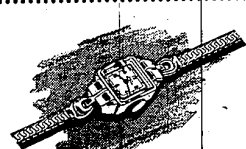

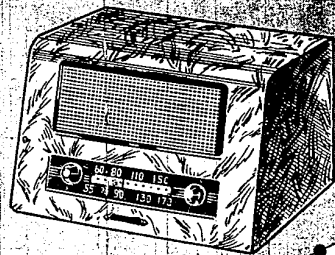
