WALLED LAKE SCHOOL ELECTION IS JUNE 10
The annual school election of the Walled Lake Consolidated Schools will be held on Monday, June 10. Polls will be open from 1:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. in five places: Commerce School, Wilson School, Walled Lake High School, Bassett School and Union School. Electors will vote in the district in which they are registered.

School electors who live in the Bassett and Wilson districts will be voting as part of the Walled Lake Consolidated School District for the first time. All who wish to vote from these two districts must register since Walled Lake is a registration district. Those who have not registered in any part of the district may register at one of the following places beginning Monday, June 3, at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, June 8, from 1:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. daily except Saturday when electors may register until 8:00 p.m. at Garlands Market, Walled Lake; McFarlane's Hardware, Union Lake; Ed's Grocery, Wilson and Woodworth's at 806 S. Lake Drive. Please register in the area in which you live. Following the election, at 8:30 p.m. the annual school meeting will be held in the small gymnasium of the Walled Lake building. All school electors are invited to attend this meeting at which the annual report will be presented by the secretary and treasurer.

During the annual election, three issues will be voted upon: election of one officer for a three year term; shall the school district be financially aided by the state for the first six grades; and shall the tax limitation of 15 mills be raised to twenty mills for a five year period to provide for a built-up fund? All persons who are citizens of the United States, 21 years of age, or residents of the State of Michigan for six months and a resident of the school district for 20 days, may vote on all three of these issues.
