Only City Residents Are Required To Re-Register

Re-registration of voters in the City of Farmington is proceeding at a faster rate this week. Voters are apparently realizing that less than two weeks remain in which they may register before the deadline, October 16.

Up to noon on Wednesday, 1970, City voters had re-registered. This is not even a third of the eligible voters within the city, but it is encouraging in view of the fact that the bulk of these registrations have come in within the last two days.

Due to the large amount of publicity that has been given the statewide re-registration of voters living in communities where a permanent registration system has never been established, it does not seem possible that anyone would not know about it. However there may still be some who do not understand that this re-registration is necessary, even though they voted in the recent primary election.

The present plans will place offices for the City Clerk and the City Treasurer across the north end of the City Hall, at the back of the room. The police department has been slightly enlarged, and will remain at the front of the building in its present location.

The new arrangement will provide a larger lobby for the customer's convenience.

Redecorating will be done in a lighter, brighter color scheme, making the building much more cheerful.

It is expected that the remodeling will be completed by Saturday of this week.
