#### BAILEY RELEASES TIPS ON WINTER CONCRETE WORK

Farmers may do concrete work n cold weather if precautions are aken, Karl D. Bailey, county agri-ultural agent said today. There s no need to stop all construction work until warmer weather.

Heat hastens the hardening of Heat hastens the hardening of concrete, but cold, retards it. In mixing concrete when temperatures are below 40 degrees, sand, pebbles and water should be heated. Since the cement forms only a small volume of the materials in the batch, it need not be heated.

The county agricultural agent suggests that sand and gravel can be heated by pilling over an old metal culvert pipe, a section of smokestack or some other impro-vised firebox. With a fire kindled inside, the heat soon distribute

sufficiently hardened Mr. Bailey suggests you pour hot water on the concrete. If properly hardened, concrete will not be affected by the hot water. If frozen, concrete will be softened by the heat. Test before removing forms.

Calcium chloride may be used to speed hardening, but not more than two pounds of calcium chloride per sack of cement should bejused. It should be dissolved in water be-fore being placed in the mixer.
