THE NEWLY ORGANIZED Exchange Club Orchestra made its first appearance at the meeting on Wednesday. Orchestra members are Jim Marshall, Vance May, Bob Lindhorst and Gene Hyman.

Speaker at Wednesday's meeting was Hugh Wehrly, who spoke on "Current Economic Trends". Mr. Wehrly used a series of charts to acquaint the group with the history of the exchange club.

He started with the chart, "Who Are We?", dealing with trends in population, families, civilian labor forces, and other statistics, comparing figures for 1940 with those of 1910.

The second chart, "What Have We Got?", dealt with individual incomes, taxes, savings, money in circulation and the National Debt, while the third chart concerned price and income trends.

client equipment to handle postal business properly.

Rural carriers shall be promoted successively at the beginning of the quarter following one year's satisfactory service in each grade to the next higher grade until they reach the 11th grade (for a standard 30-mile daily route, an increase of \$54 a year is provided in each grade through grade 11). Carriers who perform faithful and meritorious service shall be promoted to grade 12 after three years of such service in grade 11, and shall be promoted to grade 13 after five years of such service in grade 12, and shall be promoted to grade 14 after seven years of such service in grade 13. (Public Law 134, 79th Congress of July 8, 1946)

The examination will be open only to those citizens of, or persons who owe allegiance to, the United States who are actually residing in the territory of the Post office where the vacancy exists, who have been actually residing there for one year next preceding the closing date for receipt of applications, and who meet the other requirements set forth in Form 1977 of July 1946. Both men and women, if qualified, may enter this examination, but appointing officers have the legal right to specify the sex desired in requesting certification of eligibles.


