VETERANS OFFERED FREE REST PERIOD

Rehabilitation Foundation Inc. is founded by Blue Star Mothers, Inc., Department of Michigan, for the purpose of providing free rest, recreation and rehabilitation resulting from use of its facilities for center for all worthy veterans of World War II. It is financed and conducted solely by the Blue Star Mothers and any veterans who have used to use its facilities have no expense there for food, housing and usage. They provide their own strictly personal expenses, if any. However, extreme cases may even be provided with needed personal requirements.
Few questions are asked as to why the veteran may have use of the Rehabilitation Center. He may just need rest. He may be recovering from illness or hospitalization. He may need a period to readjust himself since returning from military service, or he may have no temporary home. Whatever may be his need, if there is a ground for thinking the Center might be of value to the veteran, let him or his friends consult the Rehabilitation Foundation as to his being permitted to make a stay at the Center. The veteran served unquestioningly and the Rehabilitation Center is his to use in the same manner.
The Rehabilitation Center is located on property owned by Blue Star Mothers, comprising about one hundred acres, on Indian Lake, a private lake, between Pontiac and Lapeer, off U. S. 24, 2 1/2 miles northeast from Lake Orion Village, in Northern Oakland County. There is a fine oak lodge, modern, comfortable, warm, with twenty beds, library and lounging quarters.
The manager and her assistant are always at hand to serve. Veterans or their friends or public officials or veterans organizations are invited to inquire and assist in sending needy veterans to enjoy the opportunities of this project.

ADDITIONAL REFORMS ARE RECOMMENDED
George B. Galloway, staff director of the Monroney's La Follette congressional committee, which drew up the reorganization legislation, recently proposed seven new fields of congressional reform:
1. Avoid legislative deadlocks and promote better teamwork between congress and the President.
2. Create unified, clearly located, responsible leadership in congress for the legislative program.
3. Reduce the non-legislative work load on congress so as to free congressmen from errand running and permit them to concentrate upon their legislative duties.
4. Choose committee chairmen other than on the basis of seniority.
5. Eliminate the filibuster in the senate.
6. Solve the problem of the powers and procedure of the house committee on rules.
7. Establish adequate safeguards against extension of the patronage system to the new professional committee staffs.
It will be a long time before all these suggestions are adopted. Meanwhile some of those already in the law will be modified slightly in use. Just as an automobile or ship "shakes down" after a certain amount of mileage has been achieved.
