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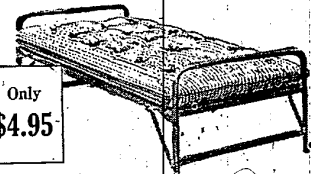
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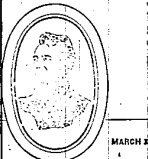


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100th Anniversary of the Birth

Alexander Graham Bell's invention of the telephone was the achievement of a trained scientific mind.
