NEW MILK TESTING PROGRAM STARTED IN THIS AREA

A new type of milk testing program will be sponsored by the Jackson County Extension Service to serve farmers in the South Lyon, Northville, Farmington, Wixom and Milford areas.

This new type of organization known as owner-sampler testing will be made available to farmers on a cooperative basis. Much interest has been evidenced by farmers in this area in milk testing work that would provide them with records on individual cows in their dairy herds.

E. W. Alchin, assistant county agricultural agent, explains that the new testing program, although unofficial, as far as registered records is concerned, would be invaluable to herd owners in selecting females for breeding purposes in their herds. Mr. Alchin says that under the new system the owner will take samples of milk once a month from each cow and keep their own weight records. The milk would be picked up by a tester who would take the samples to a central laboratory where the test would be run and monthly butterfat production compiled and returned to the farmer.

The program is designed to bring a testing service to those farmers who are interested in building up more efficient production in their herds by careful selection of cows from which they wish to keep better herds.

The new system will have an advantage in that it would enable farmers who wish to improve their dairy herds for official dairy herd improvement testing later on.

PREPARE FOR CHICKS BEFORE THEY ARRIVE

Farmers who have placed orders for baby chicks should be preparing now for their arrival says H. C. Zindel, extension poultryman at Michigan State College.

The success that farmers have with their chicks often depends on how they care for them during the first 10 days. It is then that the chicks learn to eat and find the source of heat in the brooder house. If conditions are not suitable, they often die or do not grow at the proper rate.

When the chicks arrive, the house should be clean and warm. The floor should be covered with dry litter. If you start the brooder stove about 48 hours in advance, the house should be warm enough. With a coal or oil brooder, the thermostat should be adjusted so there is a temperature of about 95 degrees about 2 inches above the floor at the brooder edge. A little higher temperature is recommended for an electric brooder. The chicks can be taught not to get too far from the heat by placing a guard of boards or wire about 18 inches from brooder house.

As soon as the chicks arrive, they should be fed. A good starter mash is best for them. Feed them 4 or 5 times a day, feeding only what they will eat in one half to one hour. After the first three or four days, the mash can be placed before them at all times. The chicks should have water or milk from the time they arrive.

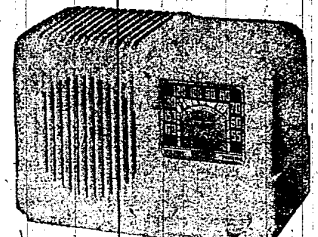
