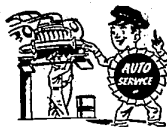

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Candidates In Contest For Mayor



DELOS HAMLIN

Delos Hamlin has been a resident of Farmington for the past 24 years, and in business in this city for twenty years. During most of this time he operated Hamlin's Market and last year he opened Farmington Recreation.

Mr. Hamlin has served the City of Farmington for the past ten years, five of which he was a member of the Commission, and the other five he has served as Mayor. He was appointed to fill the unexpired term of Leo Gillemaster, who resigned in 1942, and he was re-elected Mayor without opposition in 1943 and 1945.

During the time Mr. Hamlin has been mayor the City has acquired the Municipal Building, thus providing much needed office space at a minimum of expenditure. Prior to this time the City had no established offices. Both the water system and the sewer system have been extended and improvements have been made to the sidewalks throughout the city, at no additional cost to the taxpayers.

At present plans are under way for a sewage disposal system, and the probable annexation of Floral Park Subdivision to the City of Farmington. Long range planning has been made on several major improvements in Farmington, and preliminary work has already been accomplished.

Mr. Hamlin is Past Master of Farmington Lodge 151, F. and A. M., and is a Past President of the Exchange Club of Farmington.

With Mrs. Hamlin and their three children he makes his home at 22631 Brookdale Avenue.



ALFRED G. JONES

Alfred Graham Jones was born December 9, 1916, at Barrow-in-Furness, England. With his family he moved to Dalmuir, Scotland, and after six years returned to Barrow, where he attended school. In February, 1928, the family came to America, and settled in Highland Park, Michigan. Mr. Jones graduated from Highland Park High School in January, 1934, and from Highland Park Junior College in June 1936, specializing in Journalism, social sciences, English and languages.

He became a staff reporter for Business News Publishing Company, Detroit, in August, 1938, there meeting his wife, the former Rita Clifford of Farmington.

Following a honeymoon trip to England, Mr. Jones took a tool-making course at Chrysler Corporation, later working at Precise Tool and Manufacturing Company and Western Tool and Die Company, Farmington.

Mr. Jones was elected to the City Commission in April, 1945. He was inducted into the United States Navy in July, 1945 and served aboard the aircraft carrier, U.S.S. Franklin, as Division 1C in the Engineering Division. He received his honorable discharge in April, 1946, and returned home to launch his business, "Graham Typewriter Shop", and to resume his duties as commissioner, and also as church school superintendent and local preacher in the Methodist Church.

Mr. Jones has served three years as Y.M.C.A. Camp Counselor, three years as Y.M.C.A. boys group leader and two years as Youth Fellowship leader.

He resigned from the City Commission on March 19 in order to become a candidate for mayor.

With his wife and daughter, Marilyn, he resides at 22933 Power Avenue.

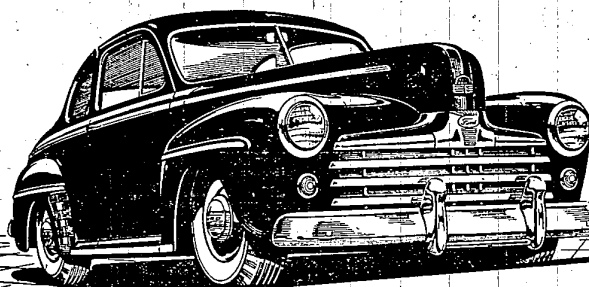

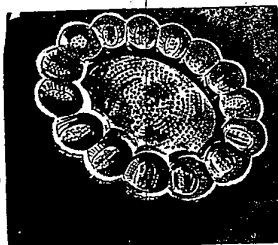
