### NEW SUBDIVISION IS OPENED ON EIGHT MILE ROAD

Mills and Kneeshaw, 12801 Puritan Avenue, Detroit, have just announced the opening of a new subdivision on the Eight Mile Road, just east of Farmington Road. ### ERUPTION OF MOUNT HEKLA

It shows a general view of the dense clouds of ash and fumes which reached a height of six or seven miles. The peak was ablaze clear across the top. Residents of nearby villages were evacuated in a precautionary measure. No lives have been lost, but a lot of damage is inflicted upon grazing lands, which are rapidly being covered with ashes.

### OAKLAND COUNTY PLANS MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM

A long felt need for the general public to have an opportunity to become informed regarding problems of mental health is now being met in Oakland County. An Oakland County Branch of the Michigan Society for Mental Hygiene has recently been formed. It is a purpose of this organization to conduct instructional programs on various phases of mental health on a level that can be understood by the layman. It is hoped that this group may be able to bring about a better working relationship between various existing agencies in the field of mental health and encourage the establishment of other needed resources.

The organization was formed to meet the need brought about by the realization of the importance of an understanding of mental health problems by every person. The old common concept that mental illness is either totally mentally healthy or desperately mentally ill has fallen to scientific findings of recent years. With the understanding that every person has problems of mental health confronting them through their lifetime, the need for an opportunity to become acquainted with the scientific aspect is apparent. The Oakland County Mental Hygiene Chapter is attempting to meet this end.

The general public is invited to attend an open meeting of the Oakland County Chapter on April 15 at 8:00 p.m. at the Pontiac Senior High School, located on West Huron Street in Pontiac. John M. Dorsey, MD and Constantine Mehas, MD, will speak on one of the important mental problems of the "alcoholism". All people interested in mental health are urged to attend.
