years.

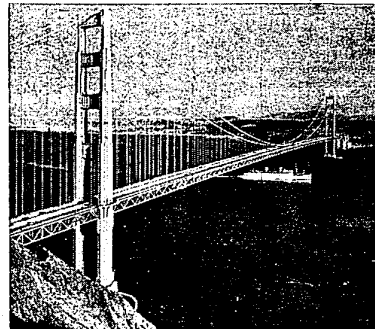
Funeral services were held on

BRIDGE HAS TENTH BIRTHDAY



SAN FRANCISCO, CALIF. — They said it couldn't be done, but in celebrating its tenth birthday May 27, 1947, the Golden Gate Bridge will silence the last of the skeptics. The doubters said the Gate could never be spanned; that if it could, the bridge would cost \$112,000,000 and then it would fall down; and finally that traffic across it wouldn't even pay its maintenance cost. Actually — it cost less than \$35 million; it stands a solid guardian over the Golden Gate; nearly 20,000 automobiles cross it daily; and it doesn't cost the counties that underwrite it a dollar in tax money. The birthday party, given by the directors of the bridge, will honor the man who built it, the part it played in the movement of men and material in the war, and its share in the building of the West. The bridge, with the longest span in the world, 1,200 feet, links Mexico with Canada along the Pacific Coast and unites San Francisco with the other counties of the Redwood Empire in Northcoastal California and Southern Oregon.

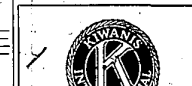




