Local Guernseys Set Records

Peterborough, N.H. — Five registered Guernsey cows of Farmington, Michigan, have completed one Herd Improvement record and four official Advanced Register records that were supervised by the Michigan State College and reported to The American Guernsey Cattle Club for approval and publication.

They are Meadow Brook Katrina, owned by C. B. DeVling, which produced 5949 pounds of milk and 397 pounds of butterfat starting her record as a two-year-old. Also Cesar Noblin's Joyce, Cesar Golden Jerebel, Cesar Penwyn's Diamond and Cesar Penwyn's Amelia, owned by Charles E. Sorensen.

In three times daily milking for a ten-month period, Cesar Noblin's Joyce produced 5,922 pounds of milk and 570 pounds of butterfat starting her record as a three-year-old. Jerebel produced 5873 pounds of milk and 475 pounds of butterfat starting her record as a three-year-old. Amelia produced 12,453 pounds of milk and 635 pounds of butterfat starting her record as a two-year-old. Diamond produced 10,153 pounds of milk and 583 pounds of butterfat starting her record as a four-year-old.

Katrina is a daughter of the registered Guernsey sire Spar Hill Demetrius, owned by Mrs. Alfred G. Wilson, that has seven Performance Register daughters. Joyce is a daughter of the famous Guernsey sire Bourndale Noble owned by Mr. Sorensen, that has thirty-five Performance Register daughters. Jerebel is a daughter of the outstanding Guernsey sire Cesar Golden Max owned by Mr. Sorensen, that has one son and ten daughters in the Performance Register. Diamond and Amelia are daughters of the outstanding Guernsey sire Cesar Maxine's Penwyn, owned by Mr. Sorensen, that has twenty-four sons and daughters in the Performance Register of The American Guernsey Cattle Club.

Floods Show Danger Of Leaving Fields Bare

Floods and spring rains have shown many farmers the danger of erosion in their fields.

E. C. Sackrider, federal soil conservationist at Michigan State college, states that observations during the wet weather of April showed the value of winter cover crops as a protection against erosion.

Last year Michigan grew over one and one-half million acres of corn, and it is estimated that over a million acres went into the winter without the benefit of a cover crop. In addition to the bare corn land, most of last year's potato and sugar beet land was unprotected by cover crops. Because of favorable fall weather much fall plowing was done, leaving additional acres exposed to the spring rains.

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GOVERNOR SIGNING JUNE DAIRY MONTH PROCLAMATION



Governor Kim Soper signing the June Dairy Month Proclamation recognizing the importance of our \$200,000,000 dairy industry to the general welfare of the citizens of Michigan. Members of the Dairy Month Committee, L. N. Franke, Michigan Allied Dairy Assoc., A. C. Baltzer, Michigan State College, Charles Stone, American Dairy Association, F. M. Skiver, Michigan Department of Agric., and Stanley Powell, Michigan Farm Bureau, are receiving the proclamation from Governor Soper.

Michigan with 1,680,000 dairy cows ranks sixth in the Nation as a dairy state producing annually over 2 1/2 billion quarts of milk, the sale of which accounts for over one-third of the farm income, in some counties it is the source of 50 to 60% of all farm income.

MILK COWS MAY NEED GRAIN ALONG WITH PASTURE
 The question of supplemental grain feeds for dairy cattle on pasture presents problems when cattle are first turned out, according to D. L. Murray, extension dairyman at Michigan State college.

When cows first go to pasture, they frequently have no appetite for any additional feed. As soon as they are accustomed to the grass, in a week or ten days, they will be looking for supplementary feed and some dry roughage.

For cows giving approximately 20 pounds of milk on grass, very little additional feed is necessary. For cows giving over 30 pounds of milk, yielding 40, 50 or 60 pounds, a cereal grain supplement is needed to maintain body weight and level of milk flow. A mixture of 500 pounds of oats and 500 pounds of wheat or corn is satisfactory. If some other grain is available, such as barley or rye or milky products, they will serve just as well as the corn, oats or wheat.

BACKWARD SPRING MAY INCREASE STATE CORN CROP

Michigan corn acreage could establish new records this year as farmers prepare to seed in one of the most backward springs in many years. Farm crops department officials at Michigan State college say the 1946 record seeding of 1,830,000 acres may be surpassed this spring.

Little of the intended 1,600,000 acres of oats and barley was planted by early May because of the cold, wet spring. Although many farmers, determined to get a small grain crop in the ground, continued planting, much of that intended acreage has been held for planting of other crops.

Corn seeding may be accomplished late in May with good prospects of maturing. Bean acreage, particularly in areas adapted to the crop, may also be increased due to inability of some farmers to plant oats or barley. Corn requires a good seed bed preparation, but unless the weather continues unusually bad, there will be ample time for planting. Adequate supplies of hybrid corn seed are available in Michigan.
