**VETERANS NEWS**

**OFFICE OF VETERANS' AFFAIRS LANSING**

**APPLICATIONS FOR AUTOS MUST BE FILED BY JUNE 30**

Veterans eligible for automobiles under Public Law 663, 79th Congress, should make application for vehicles on or before June 30, 1947 according to a recent announcement made by the Veterans Administration.

The statement issued is as follows:

1. As to the effect of the delimiting date, June 30, 1947, for completion of claim under Public Law 663, 79th Congress, it may be stated that this is an appropriation act and the appropriation may not be obligated for the purchase of automobiles after June 30, 1947. However, in a decision dated December 26, 1946, the Comptroller General advised that VA that, as under the procedure followed by the VA for the accomplishment of the purposes of Public Law 663 an obligation in the sum of \$1600 to cover the purchase price of a vehicle or conveyance is regularly placed on record against the appropriation involved upon approval of a veteran's application, his office would not be required to object to the use of the appropriation in a particular case on or before June 30, 1947, even though the sales agreement between the seller and the veteran with respect to the vehicle or conveyance be not

executed until after that date. The appropriation "9670139, automobiles and other conveyances for disabled veterans, VA 1947" continues available until June 30, 1949, for liquidating obligations incurred on or before June 30, 1947.

2. Inasmuch as the obligation to cover the purchase price of the vehicle or conveyance may not be set up without evidence of the veteran's eligibility, it follows that section 1 and Section II of VA Form 4502, Veteran's Application for Automobile or Other Conveyance, must be completed before the obligation can be accomplished.
