Junk yard already in existence. Justice Ward Eagle pointed out that an attempt to apply the provisions of the ordinance to the junk yards already operating would prove so costly to the yard operators, that it would be virtually putting them out of business, and it was not the intent of the board, or anyone, to do away with any private business. Eagle stated that it would be better to recommend reasonable restrictions to junk yard operators, and have their cooperation than to try to enforce impossible regulations.

Residents at the meeting conceded that it was out of all reason to ask an individual to fence his property at an estimated cost of \$4,000 when the fencing would not contribute anything to improve in the appearance of the junk yard.

Applications for licensing of junk yards were given Mr. Belesky, who operates the yard on Grand River Avenue, near Pearl Street, and Mr. Robert Heater, who has a yard on Orchard Lake Road.
