

TWO LOCAL WOMEN NAMED DIRECTORS OF RED CROSS

Mrs. Edward Moseman of Farmington and Mrs. Bernard Kilton of Novi were among the 31 directors elected last week to the Oakland County Chapter of the American Red Cross.

The election took place at the annual meeting of the Chapter when Red Cross volunteers, members, directors and committee chairmen gathered at the Birmingham Community House. A citation from the American National Red Cross was presented to Milo J. Cross, 1947 Red Cross Fund chairman and the chapter received a certificate of merit because of the successful drive which totaled \$145,381.

Mrs. Glen R. Northrup, director of volunteer services of the Midwestern Area office at St. Louis was the speaker of the evening. She stressed the many changes in the Red Cross program since the war. According to Mrs. Northrup, the new training courses prepared for volunteers provide a much more business like approach to the community.

"Our program," she said, "should give special attention to community work, with emphasis on service to the hospitalized, ex-servicemen, to veterans and their families and problems associated with their adjustment to civilian life, and to serve all communities through appropriate agencies."

Sarah Parker, special nutrition consultant, employed by the chapter and working as a nutrition consultant in Oakland Gardens, was introduced by Mrs. L. L. Northrup, nutrition chairman. Mrs. Parker reported on the progress of the chapter's special nutrition program.

Aid for Blind
Every state has a program for aiding needy blind persons. Most states receive reimbursement from the federal government under the Social Security act. The federal government pays \$10 of the first \$15 given to a blind person by the state and half of additional payments up to a maximum of \$45 a person. A few states pay more than \$45 a month, but they get only \$25 from the federal government.

Congress has authorized \$1,125,000 a year for books which are distributed to adult blind persons by the Library of Congress through 27 regional libraries. Of this amount, \$260,000 is for the publication of books in Braille and other raised types; the rest is for talking books and the maintenance and replacement of government-owned talking book machines. One of these costs \$60, but a blind person may borrow one free.
