

Ancient Glass Lecture Topic

"Glass and Ancient Religions" will be the topic for the fifth talk in the St. Bernardine of Siena Adult Speakers Program, scheduled at 8:30 p.m. Friday, April 14, in the church at 3165 Ann Arbor Trail, Westland.

The speaker will be Dr. Sidney M. Goldstein, assistant professor of fine arts at the University of Wisconsin.

Dr. Goldstein is a classical archaeologist who participated in the Harvard-Cornell excavations at Sardis, Turkey, and the discovery there of the largest and most ornate synagogue of the ancient world.

He has developed a special interest in ancient glass, its technology and its use in worship.

In his talk, he will show slides of glass artifacts found in fairly recent archeological expeditions and will tell how they relate to today's religion.

Tickets for the talk are \$1. The St. Bernardine adult lecture series will be concluded May 12 with a talk by Mrs. Jo Lohmolder on "Wonders with Weeds."

St. Gerald, the Irish monk whose name is given to a Catholic church in Farmington, now has a shrine to his memory in front of the church.

Created by James Embach of Livonia, it is located at the entrance to the parish on Farmington Road north of Eight Mile and was blessed by the Rev. James O'Hagan on March 13, St. Gerald's Day.

Embach, who lives at 19566 Parker, is a University of Michigan freshman art student.

His panel depicts St. Gerald, a Benedictine monk who lived in County Mayo, Ireland, and died in 732. Also shown is a monastery and an emblem of the Blessed Virgin whose apparition before St. Gerald occurred at Knock in Mayo County.

Special ceremonies marking St. Gerald's Day included talks on vocations by the Rev. William Hoyng, CPPS, and Brother Michael, both of Duns Scotus College in Southfield, and Sister Rita of the St. Gerald parish staff.
