## Religion Update

It was something like having a psychiatrist denouncing his patient's entire family in public.

The University of Chicago's priest - sociologist, Rev. Andrew Greeley, was retained by the U.S. Catholic Bishops to do a \$500,000 study on the priesthood. And apparently disgruntled by the bishops' less than enthusiastic reaction to his labors, Dr. Greeley recently attracted international attention by announcing that the U.S. Catholic Bishops are "morally, spiritually and intellectually bankrupt."

This irresponsible clergy-beating sounded more like the profitable petulance of an ex-White House maid than a priest - professor. And, of course, priests who have suffered far more than the hands of certain bishops were disgusted by this outburst of over-simplification.

Delegates to the National Federation of Priests Councils convention in Denver voted down a proposed resolution thanking Greeley for his efforts.

THE PUBLIC is also generally sensible enough to recognize that like the U.S. Senate, the U.S. Conference of

Catholic Bishops has both giants and pygmies, who are capable of both greatness and mischief.

Yet senators are accountable to the electorate every six years, and their handling of government funds is subject to audit - or to the omniscient eye of columnist Jack Anderson.

By unhealthy contrast, the strongly liberal Catholic Church in Holland has had two archconservative new bishops thrust upon it despite anguished protests - by order of Pope Paul VI.

This authoritarian flirting with ecclesiastical revolution in what is essentially a voluntary organization, has another disastrous effect: if His Holiness continues insisting upon the sole right to appoint bishops who have no accountability to anyone but himself, then the Holy Father must be held responsible for such things as the recent scandal in the Diocese of Santa Rosa, Calif.
