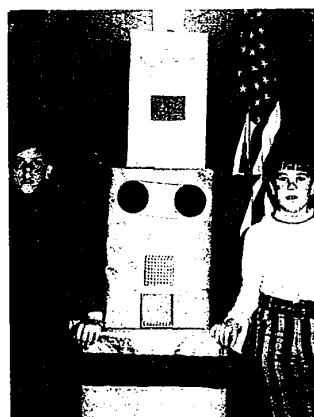
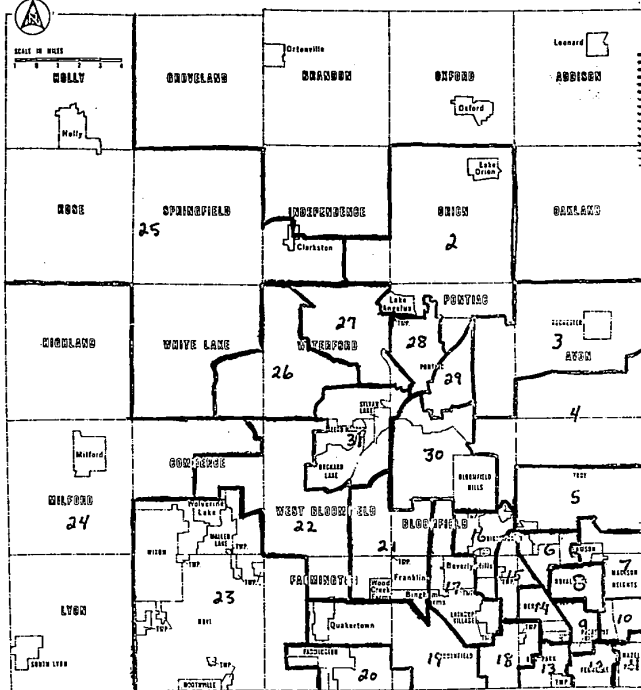


AS THINGS now stand, township voters in some precincts will be voting for different county com-

DISTRICT 19 takes in the middle section of the township, including Quakertown Village, and extends east to

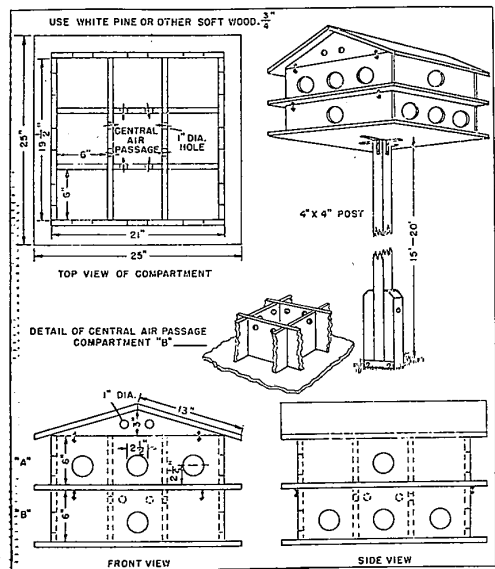

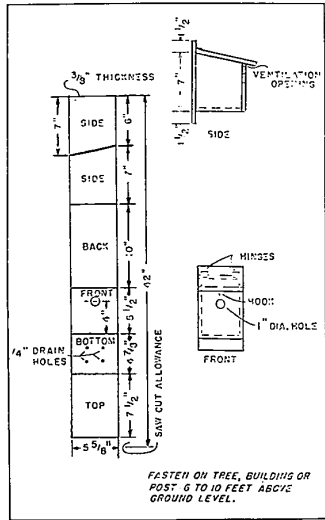
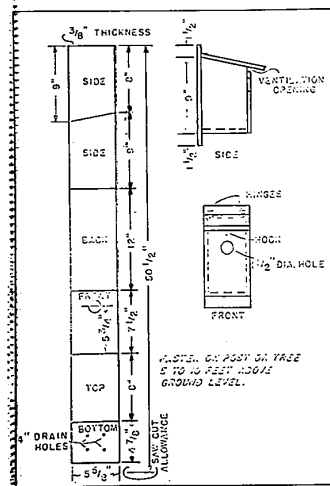

A BLUEBIRD HOUSE should have a five-by-five-inch floor, with a depth of eight inches. The entrance should be from two to six inches above the floor, and the diameter  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches -- about the size of a quarter. A bluebird house is better if it has a perch. If the wood is painted, it makes a smooth surface, but it is harder for the bird to obtain a footing. A bluebird will build in a swinging house, which an English sparrow does not like. This eliminates one of the biggest problems -- theft of the house by sparrows. Proper ventilation can be obtained at the roof line and screws and hinges on the floor board supply the cleaning outlet.



A WREN HOUSE floor should be four-by-four inches, with a depth of six to eight inches and an entrance diameter of one inch. This makes a house large enough for a wren but too small for a sparrow. A perch may be used if the builder wishes, but if it is usurped by sparrows who keep the wrens away it is better to remove it. The house may be hung in a tree or placed six to 10 feet above the ground on trellises or shrub borders. Make certain the entrance is well above flower level so hairy birds will not fall out.
