LATEST WORD IN JACKET BLURB

The three books described here have been added to the library and are available at the present time.

"Lost Men of American History" by Hollbrook tells of the many Americans who for various reasons have never been credited or acknowledged. Many of them were orthodox thinkers, men and women who went against the wind and tide. More often they were genuine prophets ahead of their times. Mr. Hollbrook has dredged our past from 1620 to Pearl Harbor for important figures who have contributed to America's development, but who because of passages of time or the vagaries of history, are now obscure and forgotten. Although their names may be unknown these men and women reveal a pattern of our national genius — a genius for the unconventional that no other nation can match.

"Curious Relations" by d'Arfey is one of the truly comic and genuinely hilarious memoirs of ancestors, kinfolk and in-laws ever to be written. William d'Arfey's books rank among the most rewarding in this category. Just as father and mother Day had Clarence, so the Mountfancous and the d'Arfey's had William who wrote about them with merciless perception as the gay, irresponsible, cockeyed characters they really were.

The author never would have written the book if it had not been for a friend who persuaded d'Arfey to set down these tales just as they were told and after the author's death they were edited and published.

"Land of the Torreones" by Kelland is perhaps in Arizona or New Mexico or Utah; it is unexplored, waterless, and mysterious with the remains of the civilization existing thousands of years ago.

Sitting luxuriously in Phoenix with the food and drink of civilization available, five people were arranging an expedition to the fabulous Torreones. Somewhere out there, according to the report of an

old mining prospector, Blignose Kelly, were rich deposits of a scarce and highly valuable mineral more precious than gold. Among the people interested in the expedition was Kelsey Bobbs, whose father was president of the International Coffee Company and the bitter rival of the Potomac Mining Company, operated by an unscrupulous man named Skillman. Kelsey, at odds with her father, had a low opinion of young men, even handsome ones, and insisted on wearing horn-rimmed smoked glasses to hide her beauty.

Kelland unravels this plot with his usual unexpected but logical twists.
