Flower Show Schedule Is Released

The Annual Fall Flower Festival, sponsored by the Farmington Garden Club will be held Saturday afternoon and evening, September 13, at the Farmington Methodist Church, Grand River and Warner Avenues. The show will open at 2:00 p.m. and continue until 3:30 p.m.

All exhibits must be in place by 11:00 a.m. on the day of the show in order to be judged. All residents of Farmington and neighboring communities are invited to participate and attend the show. The theme selected for this year's event is "Anniversaries" and exhibits will be woven around this theme.

Judging will be by the point system, with blue ribbons awarded to entries judged from 93 to 100 points, red ribbons from 85 to 92 points and yellow ribbons, 75 to 84 points.

Exhibitors may make but one entry in any class, but all are urged to enter in as many classes as possible. Stands under containers are permitted and foliage is permitted in all classes. Containers for all specimens will be provided by the committee.
