Her only attendant, Gail Shripshire, wore a beige georgette gown with pink ribbon and lace trim and carried pink sweetheart roses and baby's breath.

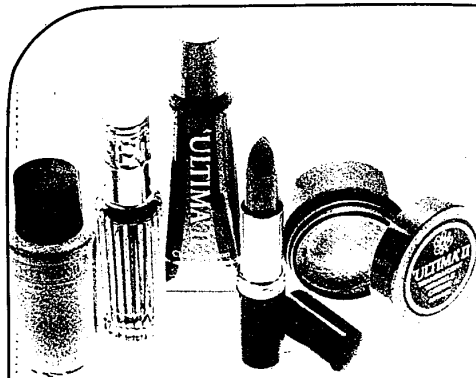
Dennis Johnson was best man.

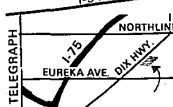
