




Local Dem Clubs Get Big Role

Local Democratic clubs in Oakland County will play a bigger campaign role in 1972 under new charter revisions, says County Chairman Morley Winograd.

They will have "major responsibility in organizing the block-by-block effort needed to elect a top-to-bottom Democratic slate this year," he said.

Observerland club chairmen include Joanne Smith, 3138 Staman Circle, Farmington, a subcommittee member of the Farmington school board citizens advisory committee, and Dan Berk of 1520 W. Nine Mile, Southfield, an attorney active in Jewish political affairs.

The way to get involved politically, says Winograd, is to contact a local club chairman.

"A major element of local club strength is the fact that chairmen are elected rather than appointed," he said.

Mercy Has New Medical Aide Course

Mercy College, 8200 W. Outer Drive, Detroit, is offering a new physician's assistant program to be introduced in the fall of 1972.

It is designed to prepare career-minded individuals to effectively assist the primary care physician in his medical activities.

This pilot program will lead to an associate in science degree after two years. Plans are under way to expand it to a four-year, baccalaureate program.

A physician's assistant functions under the supervision of a licensed physician who in turn is responsible for the performance of the assistant.

The physician's assistant will be prepared to collect a "data base" through a medical history, general physical examination and routine laboratory tests, to organize the information to aid the physician in diagnosis, and to administer treatments as prescribed by the physician.

This frees the physician from routine procedures and allows him to spend more time with the seriously ill.

The curriculum for the new program will provide a broad educational foundation in the natural sciences and the arts as well as a variety of technical skills to enable the graduate to perform in a wide choice of medical settings.

It will also provide a sound basis for the graduate to continue his education in selected areas of medical service.

Grant Assists Grad Students

The Michigan Society of Fellows, a program unique to public universities, was established in 1970 at the University of Michigan with a \$2 million Ford Foundation grant to assist graduate students "who show originality and whose interests are not regularly accommodated in other scholarship programs."
