Farm Ownership Charges

Farm tenancy declined rapidly during the past five years so that less than one-third of the nation's farms are operated by tenants, according to U. S. census figures. In 1935, 32 per cent of the nation's farmers were tenants compared to 38 per cent in 1940. The South has 40 per cent tenancy, the North 25 per cent, and the West 15 per cent. If present trends in mechanized farming continue, more farm work will be done for wages instead of as a share of the crop, believe government agricultural economists. As croppers and tenants are replaced by machinery, the economists see a trend toward fewer and larger farms.

Rings for Grooms

More than 85 per cent of marriages performed today are double-ring ceremonies. Brides are showing a distinct preference for the precious white metals, palladium and platinum; the grooms still favor the traditional yellow gold in most cases.

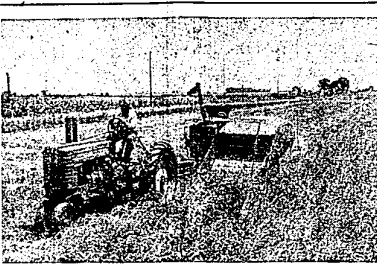

Soil Fertility Called 'Fourth Dimension' Which Enables Farm Land to Feed People



Soils Well Stocked With Fertility Can Best Perform Crop Producing Job.

COLUMBIA, MO.—Soil fertility was described as farm land's "fourth dimension" by Dr. William A. Albrecht, chairman of the soils department of the University of Missouri.

"This is the 'dimension' that enables the soil to feed us," Dr. Albrecht pointed out.

"Of all the measured farm acres by two dimensions—length and breadth," he declared, "now we include a third dimension—depth—for we know the loss of the body of the soil through erosion by running water. And this loss is greatest in the surface soil, which stores the complex residues of past crops which help us build new plants."

"But these three dimensions are not the whole story. We need to see in our soils a fourth dimension—fertility. This fertility includes the chemical elements that crops and

livestock make into food for us. It is by this dimension, and not by length and breadth and depth alone, that the soil can feed us. This fourth dimension is not as easily measured as the other three, but it is vital to a well fed, healthy people."

"Farmers who produce crops that satisfy human hunger are actually directing a great chemical industry of food synthesis that is driven by sunshine power," Dr. Albrecht said.

"Soils rich in this fourth dimension can perform their life-giving function long. Necessary to well-stocked soils are manure, plowed-over legumes which add organic matter and build up the nitrogen supply after crop residues, lime, and fertilizers. None of the factors can be judged more important than the rest, for only by the use of all of these together is the highest fertility level reached."

Land of Chile Gum Also Raises Other Farm Crops

Third largest of the Central American republics, Guatemala lies wholly in the torrid zone covering an area of 42,333 square miles, slightly smaller than the state of Virginia. The 1940 census showed a population of 2,383,209 of which 66 per cent are Indians, speaking native dialects as well as Spanish.

Foreign population numbers about 40,000. Spanish is the language of commerce although English is widely understood.

The temperature, depending on altitude, varies greatly. Most of the population lives at altitudes of from 3,000 to 8,000 feet where the climate is healthy, temperate ranging from 45° degrees in December and January to 85° degrees in March and April. The coastal lands and northern region are low-lying, hot, humid and tropical, with a mean annual temperature of about 80 degrees. The pronounced rainy season runs from May to October; dry season, November to April.

Mainly agricultural, Guatemala's chief products are coffee, bananas and chicle gum.

Fish-Loving God

When Nova Scotia was first colonized, the settlers were first amused by an Indian custom connected with corn planting. In each hill the Indians would drop a fish, chiefly upon altitude, which the white men smiled good-naturedly at what they considered the natives' naive attempt to curry favor with some obscure god. But the settlers soon discovered that the power which helps the Indians sought was not at all obscure. In fact it was very important; for when the colonists tried to grow corn without observing the same rite, the crop was always poor. So they tried the Indians' device, and found that it worked them, too. Finally the settlers discovered the identity of the god that gave good corn in return for not-so-good fish. It was fertility. And wherever he has been placated by offerings of fish, manure or anything else he particularly needed, he has repaid the offerings manifold.

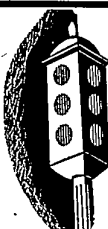
