Sheep Raising Profitable In Period Of Shortages

Sheep are a profitable farm enterprise, believes E. W. Alchin, assistant county agricultural agent. More than 50 per cent of the feed used by sheep is hay and pasture and less than 10 per cent is grain which is important in these times of high grain prices and shortages.

Sheep numbers in the United States are the lowest on record and the high level of employment together with a high level of consumer incomes is creating a demand for lamb meat.

One of the best ways to start in the commercial sheep business is to buy a flock of 20 or more mature ewes. The exact number will depend on the size of the farm and housing available.

Graydon Blank, Michigan State College animal husbandry specialist, points out that ewes that have sound mouths and sound udders are usually suitable for several more crops of lambs.

The commercial ewes need not be purebreds, but it is important to have a purebred ram of good type and body conformation. Breed choice depends on the farmer's preference and on the size and weight at which he wishes to sell his lambs.

Farmers wishing to add a flock of sheep to their farm business are urged to contact agent Alchin, who can give information concerning sources of ewes and rams.
