by the assembly on Korea. It was the word "trusteeship".

There is no word which properly translates "democracy" in Russian. When using the term the Russians merely give the English word its Russian form. But what a gulf between their meaning and ours. Liberty of the individual is not implied at all in the Russian concept.

Indeed, many people have said there is no real desire for liberty on the part of the modern Russian generation. And yet they constantly describe their country and their satellites as "democracies."

There is a Russian word which approaches the meaning of the idea back of democracy. It is a very broad, general term and embraces a concept which might be said to include love of God, brotherhood, harmony. Naturally it doesn't split the Soviet idea.

When it comes to Chinese, the problem becomes infinitely more complex.

American delegate Warren Austin had a very painful evidence of his popularity. By the time the first session opened he had his right hand in a bandage. It has been shaken until it was swollen and so sensitive he couldn't use it even for less strenuous efforts than greeding old acquaintances.

Two women are exceedingly popular at the assembly meetings and their popularity seems to grow. One is Mrs. Pandit Nehru, wife of the Indian leader, and one is Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt. They are both active and intelligent. Mrs. Pandit (last names come first in India, as in many other countries) has been an ambassador to Russia by her own government.

I can't help thinking, considering the recent emancipation of women in India that Mrs. Pandit and Mrs. Roosevelt herself, when you consider the unconventional of both judged by the standards of their respective older generations.

There was a good deal of electioneering before and during the presidency of the assembly. At first the American delegation had intended to vote for Oswaldo Aranha of Brazil. He is an old and staunch friend of the United States. But he felt that Brazil had had enough honors at the recent conference in Rio, that he had served one term before and that it would be best not to run. He said he didn't want the job. So our delegates pledged for Evatt of Australia, who was exceedingly anxious to be elected. But the Latin-Americans would have none of it. They demanded Aranha run. The contest narrowed to him and Evatt. This put Russia on the spot. Latin-America wants to liberalize

State Acquires Pine Lake School From Kelllogg Foundation

The W. K. Kelllogg Foundation of Battle Creek, in response to a request from Governor Sigler, gave to the State of Michigan a deed to the property now occupied by the Michigan Veterans' Vocational School, a project of the Office of Veterans' Affairs, located at Pine Lake in Barry County.

Improvements on the property and equipment involved, this transaction represented over a half million dollars.

Governor Sigler met Dr. Emory W. Morris, President of the Kelllogg Foundation, on Wednesday, October 1, at 12:30 p.m., at the school, at which time the students were having the noon meal. At this meeting the transfer of title was made. Governor Sigler spoke to the students and faculty in the dining room. Following the luncheon, an inspection of the school was made by Governor Sigler and invited guests.

Qualified World War II veterans may enroll at the school through Public Acts 345, 35, and 112. The school is on the approved list of the Veterans' Administration and has contracts with that agency for tuition charges. Subsistence and housing charges are kept to the minimum for the students and include health, recreational, and occupational therapy services. All teachers are certified by the Board of Control for Vocational Education and must meet the same standards as teachers in the public schools of the state. All have been selected for their sympathetic understanding of the veteran and his problems and have a sincere desire to assist him in meeting those problems. Training is individualized and is geared to the physical and mental abilities of the student. Western Michigan College of Education administers the school.

Interested veterans may secure complete details from community counseling centers.

from the barn loft. And so does the bedding, tons and tons of it.

"This straw becomes valuable fertilizer. A manure loader spreads it upon the fields where it helps to maintain soil fertility and to produce better yields of crops. See that tall corn over there? The result of lots of manure. The cows help the soil to produce more. As I said, the cows keep us. We don't keep them."
