
PIONEERS OF WORLD AIR ROUTES

Representing a fifth of a century of progress in international air service, and over 7,000,000 passengers carried overseas, Pan American World Airways this year celebrated its 20th anniversary. Captain Hugh Hovey, one of the 123 airline pilots who have flown over 1,000,000 miles, has logged over 3,500,000 miles and the equivalent of almost three consecutive years in the air since his introduction to flying in 1917. The 1917 crossing of the 90 miles of open water between Key West, Florida, and Havana, Cuba, in a wooden-winged, three motored Fokker (shown right above) flying at 85 m.p.h. and carrying only 8 passengers is a far cry from today's globe-circling in luxurious Constellation, D-C 4 and Boeing Stratocruiser type Clippers.

Start in connection with Gen. Dwight Eisenhower - namely, that there had never been a real "draft" in his day. Vandenberg said that, of course, no man would refuse the nomination if it were handed to him as an accepted fact.
He concluded his remarks with this statement: "I am not a candidate. I do not expect or wish to be a candidate. I shall seek no convention delegates or approve of others in my behalf. I think my place of service is filling out my tenure in the senate."
It may have been that statement which silenced the Vandenberg talk that one heard earlier this year. When it first appeared that there would be a deadlock between Taft and Dewey - the second choice of many observers then was Vandenberg. It may be still.

Few men's stature has increased as Vandenberg's has as a result of his participation in international affairs. I think it is fair to say that Vandenberg not only made non-partisan foreign policy possible, but that his efforts in carrying out the non-partisan principle made a unified foreign policy itself possible.
A part of Vandenberg's influence in the field of foreign affairs is due to the fact that he was the enthusiasm of a convert. He was once frankly an isolationist. Today he has converted many others, and I believe that no single man has done more than he to break down the provincial attitude, especially in the Middle West, which before World War II prevented America from taking leadership in world affairs - leadership which might have postponed, if not entirely prevented, the war.
As a Michigan newspaper editor Vandenberg supported Lodge in killing the League of Nations. His change of attitude to participation, indeed leadership, in the negotiations following World War II, both abroad and in the United States, was the result of deep personal conviction. He did not follow his constituency; he was far ahead of them; he helped convince them as he had been convinced.

It has been suggested that Vandenberg's age would prevent him from accepting the presidency, for he would be 64 when inaugurated. As a matter of fact, he is just six weeks older than President Truman. I do not believe that he is actually eliminated from the nomination, but we can be certain he will not fight for the job. He had the high vote at the Republican convention of 1940 when the Wilkie blitz struck.

BRONZE STAR AWARDS NOW AVAILABLE
New rules, announced by the War Department embodied in a circular changing Army Regulations respecting decorations, provide that all persons who in the period between Pearl Harbor and V. J. Day were cited individually for their part in ground combat will be eligible for award of the Bronze Star.
In many cases, orders granting the Combat Infantryman's or Combat Medical badges will be sufficient supporting evidence to a man's claim for the medal. However, the combat badges must have been awarded in the period between December 7, 1941 and September 2, 1945.
Frequently during combat, field units issued general orders or formal certificates to individuals for acts of valor, and these cited individually by the War Department on their merits, may also be used as support for the medal awards.
Application for the award must be submitted to The Adjutant General, Washington 25, D.C. Application must cite par. 15c, AR 600-45, and a copy of the citation or order awarding the Combat Infantry or Combat Medical Badge must be enclosed.
Reserve Commissions - Warrant Officers, flight officers and enlisted personnel of the first three grades who served honorably for at least six months on active Federal service in the AUS or one of its components, between December 7, 1941 and June 30, 1947, may apply for a commission in the OIC. Regulations require applicants to be at least 21 years of age and that they must not have passed their 28th birthday at the time of appointment in the Reserve.
