**Girl Scouts Need Additional Help**

During the past few weeks articles have appeared in The Enterprise introducing members of the board of the Farmington Township Girl Scout Council, and telling a little about their duties.

We would like, at this time, to mention briefly the "foreigner" people. These are the troop committee ladies who help the leaders whenever help is needed for parties or special occasions, and there is more to be done than the leaders and their assistants can carry out. Usually a troop is made up of a leader, one or more assistants, and three or more committee women. The leaders and their assistants meet each week with the girls, but the troop committee help out only when there is a need for extra adult workers.

These committee people are very important workers, however, and they are of great aid to the leaders. A troop with a good committee runs much smoother, and the leaders are much happier than when they function without a committee.

Another group of important people are the assistants to the board members. The committee chairmen have been introduced in previous articles, and they head the committees on organization, finance, program, training, camping and publicity. However, none of these committees could function properly with only a chairman and a few assistants. Each committee has assistants, the number varying according to the need. Every committee chairman is grateful for the fine cooperation the women on her committee have given during the past year.

The organization chairman is extremely grateful for the fine work done by Mrs. E. McKerracher. There was a great deal of reorganization done this fall and Mrs. McKerracher really was a big help in the organizing in the Noble and William Grace districts.

Many more adult workers are needed. There will be several vacancies on the Board in January. An appeal is made to every woman, especially to every mother - won't you investigate and see if there is a place for you? There won't be a place for every girl who wishes to be a Girl Scout unless more women will help, on the Board and also with the troops.

Perhaps the nearest future daughter will be told she can't be a Scout because there is no place for her and she will have to wait.

Won't you come forward so that it will not happen in Farmington? If you do not have a daughter you can spend a few hours each week profitably, anyway, so that no girl will be disappointed. ## ON CAPITOL HILL

News and Comment from Congress

**PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE—**  
**AID TO EUROPE**  
President Harry S. Truman, before a joint session of Congress, delivered his message transmitting recommendations for interim aid for certain Western European countries and a program to curb inflation in the United States. The President set forth a ten-point program which can be covered by the one word "controls." He himself

self applied it as a request for "police state methods" at a news conference on October 16th.

Mr. Earl O. Shreve sets forth in concise language his appraisal thereof as follows:

"In this proposal to the Congress the President has tied prices, inflation and aid to Europe up into one package - namely 'controls.' His proposal to help Europe is the very program that suited Europe; they have stifled initiative, controlled enterprise, debased the currency, and curtailed production. In short, he proposes the same program now for America."

Fewer controls make for greater production and greater production should bring prices down and forestall inflation.

I am opposed to destroying our own economy, losing our own freedom, and burdening our own people with a huge debt which will necessarily have to be paid by our children, their children, and their children's children.

More than twenty billion dollars' worth of American food, machinery and other goods, have been furnished to Europe, since the close of the war; and most of the countries receiving these goods are in worse condition economically, politically, and financially than at the close of the war.

**AMERICAN AID TO THE HUNGARY**  
Americans have always responded to the needs of those in distress, and I am sure that they will do so again. I favor feeding the hungry and extending aid to those countries where they show need and a desire to work, to preserve freedom and a reasonable economic stability. I will call for personal sacrifice on the part of every American. It means longer hours, greater production, America has measured up in the past and she is eagerly interested in feeding the people of Europe, there must be a voluntary sacrifice on our part.

One who has recently returned from Europe after an investigation of conditions bluntly states that Western Europe is dominated much more by fear than by the threat of hunger. People are looking over their shoulders trying to find out how soon they will fall under the domination of the Communists or of the Red Army. The same reason, people do not care to work more in order to make money. There is no incentive for greater earnings because nobody believes in the safety of savings or investment.

As long as Western Europe cannot be given physical safety, whatever money is being poured into it will be spent for current consumption only and not for investment. This is exactly what happened with the loan we granted to Great Britain. In extending help to these countries we must guard our own economic life. If we are to be of value to the rest of the world, we must be strong at home, and in no other way. We must remain so, or there is no other hope for world peace. When home power is lost, world power is lost."
