**FARMERS URGED  
TO PREPARE FOR  
LAMBING NOW**

A little extra time spent in preparation for lambing and at lambing time is better insurance than trusting to luck for raising a large percentage of the lambs born, says R. H. Nelson, Michigan State college animal husbandry specialist.

It is important to know when to expect the first lambs. Lambing will start about 145 days after the ram was turned with the ewes.

If the ewes are not sheared before lambing, they may become matted. The long wool should be clipped from the flanks and udder to help the new lambs find the teats. It will also help save time in getting the weak lambs started nursing.

Shearing ewes before lambing should be done carefully and rough handling avoided.

Individual lambing pens will reduce the time spent on chilled and weak lambs. They will also help prevent older lambs from "stealing" milk from the younger ones and make possible continued feeding of the ewe for a couple of days after lambing.

Lambing pens do not need to be elaborate and can be of the temporary movable type.

Clean, dry quarters should be provided at lambing. Four to four and a half months after breeding, the barn or shed should be cleaned and bedded down with clean, dry bedding. Dry shelter is more important than warm shelter for sheep, particularly at lambing time.

**NAVAL RESERVE  
COMMISSIONS OPEN  
TO EX-MILITARY MEN**

Commissioned rank in the Naval Reserve is open to certain former enlisted Navy men now honorably discharged.

Enlisted men who served with the Navy for less than one year and who have satisfactorily completed a four-year course of at least 120 semester hours at an accredited college or university are eligible to apply.

Men who have more than one year's service in the Navy may deduct an equivalent year of college education for each year of active service during the war, providing the candidate is of the four-year college educational level. However, no more than two years of the college requirement may be waived because of active duty, and active duty in a student status cannot be considered in satisfying the college educational requirement.

Candidates must have been discharged honorably, be between the ages of 19 and 30 years, inclusive, veterans of World War I (service between December 7, 1918 and September 2, 1919) and American citizens.

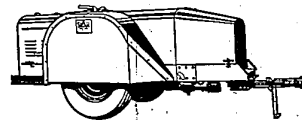

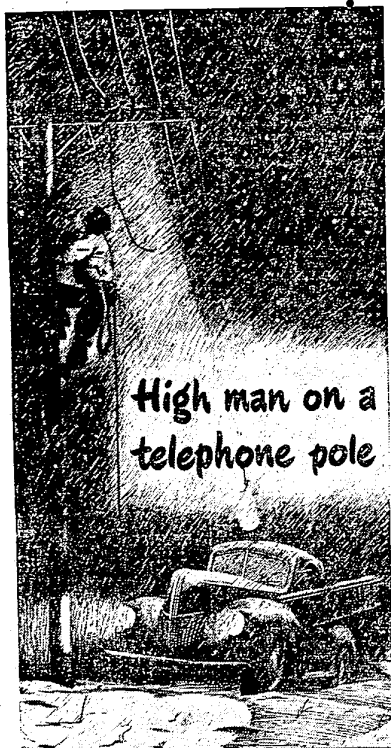

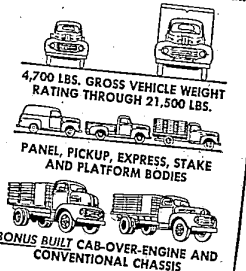
