PFC LEWIS HOWARD ATTENDS AIRBORNE SCHOOL IN JAPAN

Private First Class Lewis B. Howard, 20 year old parachutist with the 11th Airborne Division, recently completed a one week course in Air Transportability at the 11th Airborne Division Training Center at Yamato, Japan. Pfc Howard is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Edgar Howard of 25255 Haled Road. The training at the Airborne School consisted of the fundamentals and the loading and lashing of equipment in U.S. Army transport planes (C-46 and C-52). The highlights of the course came when the trainees partook in tactical airplane flights.

Pfc Howard enlisted in the Army at Detroit, Michigan, in April of 1947 and completed his basic training at Fort Lewis, Washington. Howard was then sent overseas to Japan in October of '47 where he volunteered for parachute duty with the 11th Airborne Division. He was assigned to Headquarters, Special Troops, stationed near Sendai, Japan.

Howard is now working as clerk in A.G. Section of Division (R).

Before enlisting in the Army, Howard was a student at Farmington High School and upon discharge he plans to enter college and continue with his studies.

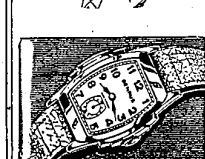
MRS. H. WALTERS WILL ENTERTAIN THE MOTHERS CLUB

Virginia Redding Richardson is being graduated from the University of South Carolina this June. She is going into dress designing. I hope she doesn't start another "new look", I'm broke.

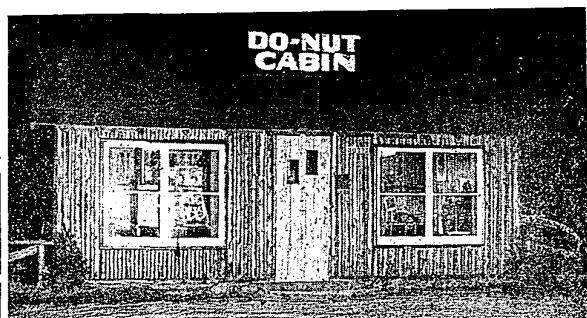
