## WEDEMEYER RECOMMENDS MILITARY AID

## NAVY RECRUITING OFFICE OPENED IN REDFORD

The United States Navy has installed a temporary Recruiting Office in Redford at 21600 Grand River in the Detroit Edison Building, which will remain there until June 30.

It is accepting men between the ages of 17 and 30, inclusive, who are in good physical and mental health, who are morally clean, who can pass intelligence tests with a grade indicating that they have at least the average intelligence now prevailing among all U. S. citizens.

To them the Navy gives the opportunity for training in one of fifty courses, he will be eligible to take correspondence courses at a minimum fee. Good pay with regular increases, with all major living expenses is provided to all Navy men, plus retirement annuity which leaves his salary clear for him to do with as he pleases. All medical and dental care is free, and he may be assured of the best of care in the event of sickness. The fleet is spread round the world so he will have the opportunity to see scores of sights in numerous ports.

His companions will be some of the best young men in the country. He is guaranteed thirty days vacation annually with pay. If the man wants to earn, at the same time travel, and be eligible for retirement early in life, then the Navy is the place for him.

## LOCAL RESIDENTS RECEIVE CHECKS FOR COMPENSATION

Over 2350 unemployed compensation checks totaling more than \$54,571.50 have already been paid to local residents in this community who were laid off as a result of the recent gas shortage, according to S. J. McLeod, Branch Manager of the local Michigan Unemployment Compensation Office serving the Redford area.

James Mitchell, Assistant Branch Manager in charge of Unemployment Compensation, said, "the local office has been mailing about 275 checks daily for the past week. Checks should now be in the hands of all recently unemployed workers eligible for unemployment compensation, who have returned their white back-to-work card (Form 729)," he said. Local workers who have returned to their jobs were urged by Mitchell to immediately mail the Form 729 given to each worker at the time of filing a claim, if they have not already done so. "This card must be mailed to the local office before the worker's check can be processed," he said.

Workers who have filed for unemployment compensation, but have been found ineligible for a check under the law, are being advised by mail, local officials said.
