SINCLAIR BULK PLANT CLOSED AT NORTHVILLE

After some fifteen years of operation in this community, dedicating to service stations, commercial, farmers and heating oil accounts, the Sinclair Northville Bulk Plant will be merged with the Wayne sales area.

Mr. William C. Hartmann, the present local Commission agent, will be in direct charge of the Wayne Bulk Plant. Mr. Gilbert there will go to Wayne as Foreman, as will John Shum and Anthony Szukaltis, better known as Johnnie and Tony. The latter two men will serve this area in the capacity of commission drivers. They will cover the same area they did when operating out of the Northville plant, the only change being that all merchandise will come out of the Wayne Bulk Plant.

Sinclair Refining Company within the last year has completed its terminal on Ford Road and Wyoming Avenue, Detroit. Gasoline for the local service stations will be delivered direct from the terminal to the stations. Larger tanks will be installed at the various service stations, thereby permitting larger deliveries, which will be made with a 5,000 gallon company unit.

Under provisions of the State Election Law, persons who are eligible to vote, but who have not registered, may do so on election day, providing they reside in the precinct in which they wish to vote, are 21 years of age, and have resided within the state for six months, and within the township or city for 30 days, and also providing they were unable to register during the registration period before the election because of sickness or absence from their home. They must apply for registration before 4:00 p.m. and be accompanied and identified by a registered voter known to a member of the election board.

Election boards have been appointed to serve for this special election, and to tabulate the votes after the polls close.
