Barnboards, for example, have become popular in room modernization. Since old barns are fast disappearing, enterprising manufacturers have produced modern paneling with the appearance of weathered barnwood but with easy cleaning and longwearing qualities of hardboard.

These panels savor the texture of weather-worn wood. They have vertical and horizontal planks, duplicating the charm of authentic post and beam construction of old. They come in four colors (gray, red, white and green), authentic down to the knots and nail heads.

PRODUCTS SUCH as this 16" x 8' prefinished woodgrain plank by Marlite make it easy for the home handyman to finish wall. Tongue and grooved edges simplify fitting. This shell pecan plank, a durable plasticfinished hardboard, may be used in any room in the house. Planks come with detailed instruction sheets and harmonizing moldings are available.
