GREAT SON
This book, taken from family pa-
pers, books, and manuscripts, is
a blend of fact and fiction.
Seattle boasted two canals, man-
made, two ample lakes which lay
glittering and dimpling, and form-

ot Bay, Puget Sound, and the
Strait of Juan de Fuca. To the west
lay the Olympics with their snow
covered ridges. The Cascade moun-
tains, blue-green in the distance,
lay to the east. Above the whole,
with dramatic finality of a com-
plete masterpiece - above rivers,
lakes, bays, straits, hills, forests,
and mountain peaks - loomed the
queen peak, Mount Rainier, eternal
ly snow crowned. Being a queen,
she rarely permitted her subjects
to see her glorious face, but on
brilliant days she swept aside her
concealing folds of gray cliffion
and emerged a dazzling creature,
her face and form shining with a
million jewels of ice and snow.
Indeed, it was a colossal feat of
Nature. It was too much for the
average family, but not for the Mel-
endys.
Edna Ferber's "Great Son" pre-
sents a dynamic story about the four
generations of the marvelous Mel-
endys, a frontier family grown rich
and ill with ease.
It is the thrilling narrative of a
