Proper Tractor Repair
Will Save Fuel Bills

Michigan farmers can cut their tractor fuel bills as much as ten percent by making certain that carburetors are properly adjusted. E. C. Saure, agricultural engineer at Michigan State college, reports that field surveys indicate that the average tractor wastes from 50 to 150 gallons of fuel each year. This is costly to the farmer and aggravates the supply situation which is expected to be tight this year.

Adjustment of the carburetor is the most common fault, but overloading and overrevving, worn carburetor parts, spark plugs and valves worn or out of adjustment, low radiator temperatures, and improper intake manifold temperatures may also cause high fuel costs.
