ORDINANCE NO. C-24-48

AN ORDINANCE TO LICENSE AND REGULATE BILLIARD PARLORS, POOL ROOMS, BOWLING ALLEYS, OR OTHER PLACES OF PUBLIC AMUSEMENTS.
 THE CITY OF FARMINGTON ORDAINS:
 Section 1. It shall be unlawful, from and after the passage and effective date of this ordinance, for any person, firm, association, company or corporation to establish, maintain or operate as a commercial enterprise, in any public place of the City of Farmington, any billiard parlor, pool room, bowling alley or other place for the playing of games by the public until a license therefor shall have been issued by the City Commission.
 Section 2. Application for licenses to operate such places of public amusement, as set forth in Section 1, shall be made on forms provided for the purpose and shall be filed with the City Clerk for presentation to the City Commission. Said application shall set forth the full name of the applicant or applicants and every person interested in the issue of the license applied for, together with the business and residence address of such persons; Provided, that if the applicant be a partnership, the names of the officers and directors thereof need be given. Each applicant shall also state the place or places where it is proposed to establish, maintain or operate the billiard parlor, pool room, bowling alley or other amusement device or games for which a license is asked, and state the number and kind of such devices.
 Section 3. The City Clerk shall keep a record of all applicants and the action taken thereon by the Commission, and shall present all applications to the Commission at the next regular meeting or filing. The Commission shall investigate the character, reputation and qualifications of the applicant and if found to be of reputable character and suitably qualified for the proposed operation, the City Clerk may be directed to issue the license upon the payment of the fee or fees hereinafter provided. The license so issued shall be subject to compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.
 Section 4. Before any license shall be issued under the terms of this ordinance, the applicant or applicants shall pay to the City Treasurer as a license fee for establishing, maintaining, or operating a billiard parlor, pool room, bowling alley and places for playing public games, the sum of Five Dollars (\$5.00) per annum, beginning July 1, 1932, for each billiard table, pool table, bowling alley or other device for playing at public games; Provided, that all billiard parlors, pool rooms, and bowling alleys where more than one billiard table, pool table or bowling alley is installed, the license fee shall be Five Dollars (\$5.00) per annum for the first table or alley and Two Dollars (\$2.00) per annum for each subsequent table or alley. The payment of the aforesaid sum shall entitle the licensee or licensees to establish, maintain and operate the devices and places licensed for the period ending the 30th day of June following the date of issuance; Provided that one-half the full license may be charged when the application is filed after the 1st day of January.
 Section 5. Licenses issued hereunder may be revoked at any time by the City Commission for violation of the terms of this ordinance. Violation of any state or federal law or violation of any reasonable regulation of the City Commission generally imposed upon licensees under this ordinance.
 Section 6. Each license issued under the provisions of this ordinance shall be closed to the public from 2:00 o'clock A.M. until 6:00 o'clock A.M.; Provided, that no place licensed under the provisions of this ordinance, excepting bowling alleys, shall be opened to the public from 1:00 o'clock A.M. Sunday morning until 1:00 p.m. Sunday afternoon, and bowling alleys shall not be open to the public from 2:00 o'clock A.M. Sunday morning until 11:00 o'clock A.M. Sunday morning; the time as set forth herein shall be the official time of the City. No place of public amusement shall be open on Sundays after the hours above mentioned, except by special permission of the City Commission.
 Section 7. The licensee shall be responsible for maintaining quiet and good order at all times in and about his premises, and no person shall be permitted to loiter or stand in or about the doorway, or in front of said premises. No person shall be permitted to play any games on which a hot or wager is laid, or no person shall be permitted to lay any wager or bet on the outcome or result of any game played on the premises. No person licensed under the provisions of this ordinance shall be permitted to operate, any card tables for the public playing of cards, and shall not permit within the premises licensed for the playing of billiards, pool, bowling or other public games, any public playing of cards, and the words "public games", as used in this ordinance, shall not be deemed to include any games played with cards. No person licensed under the provisions of this ordinance shall operate or permit to be operated, any games played with dice, or any other gambling device, including "pools", "numbers", "lotteries" and "punch boards".
 Section 8. No screens, curtains, drapes, shades, partitions, or other obstruction shall be permitted in places, except bowling alleys, licensed under the provisions of this ordinance which obstructs the view from the streets of any or all portions of said place of public amusement; Provided, however, that no portion of a billiard table, or other amusement device shall be deemed an obstruction which does not extend more than forty-two (42) inches from the floor and does not appreciably interfere with the view of the premises. Any such screens, curtains, drapes, shades or partitions or other obstructions shall be deemed a public nuisance and may be confiscated, removed or destroyed at any time by the police officers of the City.
 Section 9. No minor, under seventeen (17) years of age, shall be permitted to play billiards, pool or participate in any of the devices for public amusement licensed under this ordinance, nor shall such minor be permitted to loiter about or remain in any pool room, or other place of public amusement, except when accompanied by his parent or legal guardian; Provided, however, that unaccompanied minors between the ages of fourteen (14) and seventeen (17) years shall be permitted to bowl in bowling alleys, where no beer or liquor is served or sold; Provided further, that no bowling by such minor shall be permitted after eight (8:00) o'clock P.M. No regularly enrolled student of any public, private or parochial school in the State of Michigan shall be permitted to remain in any place licensed under this ordinance when such school is in session, or after eight (8:00) o'clock P.M. It shall be the duty of any owner, proprietor or manager of a billiard parlor, pool room, or other place of public amusement, and he shall have the right to investigate any one playing at or participating in such public amusement, or remaining within such place who appears to be a minor, and he shall refuse to permit any such person to participate in an amusement device or remain in his place of public amusement who fails or refuses to furnish proper proof that he is seventeen (17) years of age or over. Any person giving false information regarding his age to a police officer or person in charge of such place shall be deemed guilty of a violation of this ordinance. Any owner, proprietor, manager or other person in charge of a place of public amusement licensed hereunder, who shall permit any minor child or minor student during school hours to loiter

or remain therein, and any person who shall encourage or induce a minor child or minor student during school hours to enter in, loiter about or remain in such place of public amusement, shall be deemed guilty of a violation of this ordinance.
 Section 10. No child under fifteen (15) years of age shall be employed, permitted or suffered to work in any place of public amusement licensed under this ordinance.
 Section 11. Any person or persons who violates any provisions of this ordinance, or any person owning or having an interest in the amusement device or devices, or places of public amusement licensed under this ordinance, who commits or is in any way responsible for such violation, may upon conviction thereof be sentenced to pay a fine of not exceeding One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars and cost of prosecution, or may be sentenced to the County Jail, or other lawful place of confinement, for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days, or both in the discretion of the Court.
 Section 12. This ordinance and the various sections thereof are hereby declared to be severable. If any Section or Clause is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, it is hereby provided that the remainder of the ordinance shall not be affected thereby.
 Section 13. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.
 Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days from and after the date of its final passage by the City Commission of Farmington.
