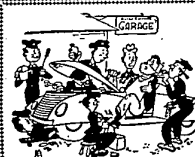

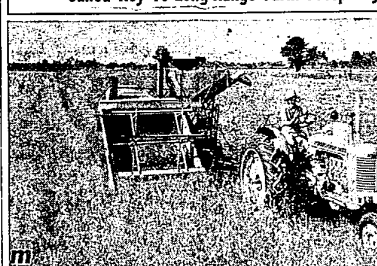

Building Soil While Crop Yields Are High Called Key To Long-Range Farm Prosperity



Bumper crop yields and good soil management go hand in hand.

CHICAGO—Waiting for crop yields to drop before building your soil is like calling the end of the road after your house has burned down. The Middle West Soil Improvement Committee points out in a statement issued here. "The time to build up your soil is when crop yields are high," the statement declares. "That gives you immediate as well as long-range benefits. It increases your profit margin at current farm price levels, even though they have slumped from the postwar peak. It will give you a good living when the present record-breaking demand for food decreases and prices are lower. "Production costs such as seed, plowing and cultivation are about the same whether your yields are high or low. Thus it costs twice as much per unit to produce a 50-bushel crop as it does a 100-bushel crop. That can spell the difference between red or black ink in either good or bad times. Which yield you get depends largely on your soil management.

"Good soil management means more than putting fertilizer into the ground. It means replacing organic matter burned out by too many crops of corn and grain and too few crops of deep-rooted legumes. It means rebuilding broken-down soil structure and improving tilth and workability. It means increasing the soil's capacity to absorb rain and deliver moisture to your crops. It means using conservation methods that will keep the soil from washing away once you have built it up. "Under the head of soil building steps come deep-rooted legumes in the rotation, the return of manure and crop residues to the soil and the use of commercial fertilizer carrying phosphate and potash. These measures will build organic matter, repair damaged soil structure and make your soil a better 'drinking fountain' for crops. "Persistent, intelligent cultivation, strip cropping, terracing and, where necessary, building dams."
