**Two Who "Gave"**

The names of two Farmington boys who gave their lives in the World War I are perpetuated in the name of Farmington's American Legion Post — "Groves-Walker Post". They were Bertraw Groves and Lemuel Walker.

Bertraw Groves was 20 years old when he was killed in action. His death occurred on August 7, 1918, when he was struck by a one-pound shell near the River Vesle, not far from Fismes during the second battle of the Marne. Groves was on a reconnaissance patrol with four other men.
