New Bridge On Grand River To Open In August

Construction of concrete approach bridge over the Kent Lake over the Huron River, 2 1/2 miles west of New Hudson in Oakland County, has started, and it is expected the bridge will be open for traffic sometime around the middle of August, according to Highway Commissioner Charles M. Ziegler.

The new bridge is reinforced concrete with steel superstructure consisting of three rolled beam spans and two sidewalks. It was erected for the purpose of elevating the road, the new bridge will be a four-lane highway. The bridge will raise the water level of the Huron river and create the artificial Kent Lake.

E. C. Nolan and Son and Louis Garavito, Center Line, are the contractors. The contract price is \$132,206.57.
